ORDER:-

Swachh Bharat Mission, launched at the national level by the Government of India, envisions clean, neat and totally sanitized cities that are aesthetic, and environmentally healthy and livable. In line with this Mission, Government of Andhra Pradesh had set up Swachh Andhra Corporation to manage the Swachh Andhra Pradesh Programme in a mission mode. The State has a vision of transforming ***cities and towns in Andhra Pradesh into neat, clean and litter-free areas for best-in-class livability; health standards; environment, tourism and investment attractiveness.***

2. The MSW (M&H) 2000 Rules are applicable to every urban local body. The MSW Rules 2000 clearly stipulate the roles and duties of different stakeholders in the entire chain of solid waste management. Non-compliance with the rules by ULBs and not adhering to the time lines are strictly monitored by the National Green Tribunal, which has powers to impose penal actions on the state and central machineries. Furthermore, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, has notified the draft Solid Waste Management Rules, 2015.

3. With this background, after consultation with the relevant experts and discussions in the workshops, the Director of Municipal Administration, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad has submitted draft **Operational Guidelines for Micro Planning, Work Rationalization and Outsourcing of Work Packages**, for approval stating that issuance of new operational guidelines for shifting from Worker Outsourcing to Work Outsourcing System is required to guide the ULBs for effective implementation of MSW (M&H) Rules 2000, NGT recent

directives and other relevant regulations in a systematic manner, with reference to Source Segregation, Collection, and Transportation of Solid Waste.

4. The Director of Municipal Administration has further stated that despite of orders and instructions for adopting specific practices for outsourcing complete maintenance of sanitation, most of the ULBs have been found to be engaging workers on contract basis for maintenance of sanitation and this has resulted in unsatisfactory sanitary conditions and poor public satisfaction despite spending huge amounts.

5. Government, after careful examination of the draft Operational Guidelines for Micro Planning, Work Rationalization and Outsourcing of Work Packages, submitted by the Director of Municipal Administration, AP, Hyderabad, vide reference 3rd cited, hereby approve, as submitted, to enable urban local bodies in the state to implement the above guidelines. These orders are issued in supersession of all Government Orders, Circular Instructions, etc., issued previously on entrustment of works and outsourcing maintenance of sanitation in the ULBs of AP.

6. The approved operational guidelines are here with enclosed to this order as Annexure.

7. The Director of Municipal Administration, AP, Hyderabad is requested to take further necessary action in this matter.
