Swachh Sarvekshan-2017

- Ministry of Urban Development had conducted 'Swachh Sarvekshan-2016' survey for 73 cities in January 2016.
- The ranking exercise and encourage towns and cities to actively implement mission initiatives in a timely and innovative manner, MoUD now proposes to conduct its second survey to rank 500 cities (with a population of 1 lakh and above) under Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U).
- The objective of the survey is to encourage large scale citizen participation and create awareness amongst all sections of society about the importance of working together towards making towns and cities a better place to live in.
- It leads to a spirit of healthy competition among towns and cities to improve their service delivery to citizens, towards creating cleaner cities.
- Citizen participation is a very crucial component of this survey, social media and other traditional media channels will be used strategically at both national, state and city levels in order to educate citizens about the objectives of the survey and survey methodology.

Swachh Sarvekshan-2017

- The data to be collected for ranking of the cities shall be segregated into 3 main areas:

Part 1 : Collection of data from and interactions with Municipal Body

- ✓ The preliminary data needs to be collected in advance by a process of self-assessment from municipal and other related agencies with regard to solid waste management and toilets

Part 2 : Collection of data from Direct Observations

- ✓ As part of direct observation the survey agency shall be visiting the following places: in each zone in each city, Slum areas, Neighborhoods (non-slum locations), Commercial/Main public locations, Bulk waste generators viz, Community Toilets, Public Toilets.

Part 3 : Collection of data from Citizens' Feedback

- ✓ Sample size to be 1000 citizens in the city or 0.1% of city population, whichever is less. Discussions with local citizens to be carried out to ascertain and confirm data on certain indicators.

- Photos should necessarily be collected as evidence for field observations.

Swachh Sarvekshan-2017

- Part 1 contributes to 900 marks out of a total of 2000 marks and also has maximum parameters and scores as compared to part 2 and part 3. Part 2 and 3 are outcome measures and are based on qualitative assessment by the external assessors.
- The six components are as follows and their total score is given below:

Public and Community Toilets

➤ This section deals with parameters related to public and community toilet construction and maintenance. The total number of parameters is 11 and the maximum marks that a ULB can score are 135.

➤ As per the Swachh Bharat Guidelines, a public toilet within a distance of 1 kilometre and a community toilet within a distance of 500 meters.

Involvement of self-help groups in IEC/BCC activities



- The parameter is to examine the participation of self-help groups and other voluntary groups for IEC/BCC activities in the city.
- The gradation of marks is based on whether the ULB has identified, involved and utilised these groups as vehicles of IEC and BCC in their cities.
- Self-help groups are an informal group of people with same socio-economic background formed to enhance the member's financial security as primary focus and other common interest of members such as area development, awareness, motivation, leadership, training and associating in other programmes for the benefit of the entire community.
