The Secretary has informed that to encourage districts to improve Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) SBM(G) progress in their districts, MDWS is launching **District Swachhta Darpan**, an initiative to rank all districts in India based on key parameters of **performance, sustainability and transparency**. The performance of the districts will be evaluated based on key parameters with data available in SBM(G) MIS.

MDWS has devised a district ranking mechanism for SBM(G) based on key sub-parameters (annexed as Annexure I) on which all districts will be ranked on quarterly basis. On October 2, 2017, the third anniversary of Swachh Bharat Mission, top performing districts will be recognized for their efforts on progress made so far. **The current ranking for all districts in our State as on 04.08.2017, the methodology of ranking and the parameters considered for fixing ranking is enclosed herewith to the reference.**

To implement District Swachhta Darpan, NIC has developed a separate module on SBM(G) website ([http://sbm\[dot\]gov\[dot\]in/Sbm/swachhdarpan/home\[dot\]asp](http://sbm[dot]gov[dot]in/Sbm/swachhdarpan/home[dot]asp)), where the rankings of all districts will be updated on regular basis. The district report card for each district is also developed and will display the detailed back-up of score for each component. District ranking has been done for within the country and within state for all 679 districts.

State / districts may take advantage of the next two months

to enhance their progress on key parameters and updated their performance on the MIS accordingly, upon which rankings would be formulated.

Annexure I: Ranking Methodology

The performance of districts is being evaluated based on key parameters with data available in SBM (G) MIS. District with no data available on MIS for any indicator, will have zero marked against it. The key indicators to measure programme performance for each district are:

- **Performance (50%):** This indicator focuses mainly on IHHL coverage and ODF status which are the pillars of the SBM(G) implementation in the districts. Performance also includes conversion of dysfunctional toilets and insanitary toilets in the district.
- **Sustainability (25%):** As sustainability of the programme depends significantly on behavior change and IEC, fund utilization through IEC activities along with number of Swachhagrahis on the ground is being measured under this indicator .
- **Transparency (25%):** Verification and implementation of SBM(G) through geo-tagging and capturing Aadhar details is taken into consideration.

Total score (100) = Performance (50) + Sustainability (25) + Transparency (25)
